You will provide clinical leadership for Speech and language pathway across South Yorkshire Prisons. Working in a multi-disciplinary team made up of a variety of registered and non-registered professionals including; primary care, mental health, social care, end of life care and substance misuse practitioners. You will act as a role model ensuring professional appearance and maintaining professional standards at all times.

You will:

Provide outstanding evidence based care to our patients, seeking out, listening to and acting on their feedback, so that care is personalised and informed by what matters to them. Resulting in Holistic plans of care for all patients on your caseload.

Deliver non-judgemental care that makes a real difference, as defined throughout our bespoke Health in Justice Competency framework that seeks to provide the best possible outcomes for our patients.



Inspire excellence by forging strong links with your peers, our partners and stakeholders and providing a service that people can trust, feel safe within, and feel proud to be part included.

Promote best practice, clinical supervision, evidence based care and continuous quality improvement, embedding a culture of shared learning. Contributing to the wider governance framework to promote learning and best practice.
