The role

As a Clinical Lead with Practice Plus Group you will lead a multi-disciplinary team to deliver a nurse led service with duties including but not limited to:

- Supervision, leadership, co-ordination, and management of clinical staff
- Regularly assessing detainees' needs and developing services to reflect this
- Co-creating and developing care plans for detainees
- Responding to incidents in a professional and appropriate manner
- Establishing and maintaining communication with patients, relatives and staff
- Co-ordinating care in line with Detention Centre Rules 2001, Procedures and Protocols
- Ensuring medication is given in accordance with patient care plans
- Participation in supervisions and reflective sessions either 1:1 or in groups
- Assisting with admission and discharge planning
- Attending and contributing to weekly multi-disciplinary team meetings
- Managing caseloads with a flexible and proactive approach
- Completing risk management requirements throughout each detainees' pathway



You will also:

Provide outstanding evidence based care to our patients by seeking out, listening to and acting on feedback so that care is personalised and informed by what matters to them. You will also provide clinical expertise and expert advice for IRC primary care services to drive up clinical performance.

Deliver non-judgemental care that is safe, high quality, patient centred whilst meeting CQC requirements, following our policies, procedures and always considering safeguarding. You will also demonstrate a collaborative approach to working and ability to make quick and accurate decisions.

Inspire excellence in your colleagues by pro-actively leading the service and motivating the team recognising that our workforce is our most valuable asset. You will forge strong links with our partners and stakeholders, providing a service that people can trust, feel safe within and feel proud of.
